## List of probable deliveries of English Electric KDP10 and KDF8 computers.

There may have been more than the one delivery of a KDP10 computer shown below. The KDF10 as a product line was soon replaced by the KDN8 and, certainly in the case of the Commercial Union's Exeter machine shown below, the KDF10 was upgraded on site to a twin KDN8.

## One KDP10 delivery.

The first production KDP10 was installed at the Commercial Union's new Computer Centre in Exeter in January 1962, at a cost of £300,000 – see [ref. 1]. It was known as 'Cutie' (Commercial Union Totally Integrated Electronics) and cost £300,000. The CU was one of the largest UK insurance companies at the time and this installation was historically significant for a number of reasons.
